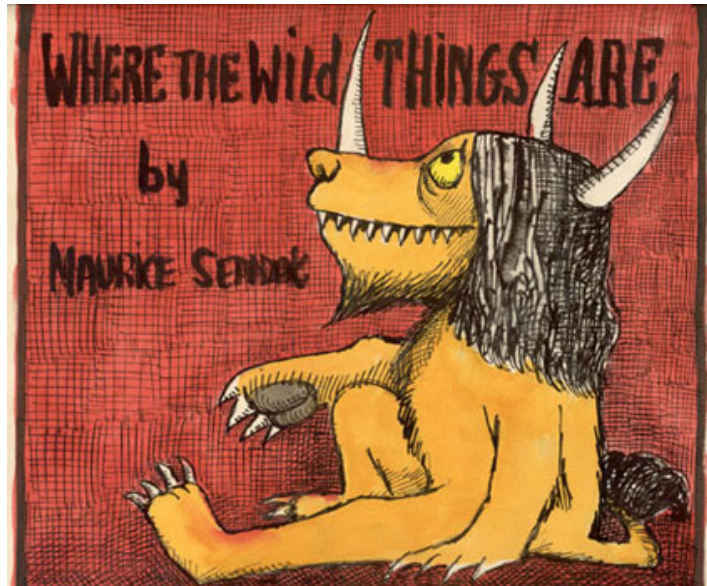


Where The Wild Kadimaniks Are

About The Exhibit:

Maurice Sendak has written or illustrated more than 100 picture books over his 60-year career. A number of those books, including *Where the Wild Things Are*, *In the Night Kitchen*, and *Chicken Soup with Rice*, inspired generations of children and changed the landscape of picture books. Included in the exhibition are original watercolors, preliminary sketches, drawings, and dummy books from more than 40 of Sendak's books, all from the Rosenbach Museum and Library in Philadelphia, the repository for Sendak's artwork and working materials. This major retrospective sheds light on the many mysteries of his life and art by exploring the intensely personal undercurrents in his work; and it does so using Sendak's own words, insights, and remarkable stories.

Sendak was born in Brooklyn in 1928, the youngest of three children. His parents, poor Jewish immigrants from Eastern Europe, suffered greatly from the loss of many family members in Poland during the Holocaust. The sadness and complexities of the Holocaust, the rich memories of his parent's lives in Europe, and his own childhood experiences with his Jewish relatives, are currents that run through all of Sendak's work. The exhibition explores a number of different aspects of Sendak's books including his child characters, monsters, literary and artistic influences, and the settings of his stories. Visitors will delve into the hidden nuances and personal secrets within Sendak's work through exclusive interviews with the artist on digital touch screens throughout the exhibition. As Sendak himself said in one such interview, "When you hide another story in a story, that's the story I am telling the children." These hidden stories within Sendak's work form the core experience of *There's a Mystery There*.

Code of Conduct:

PLEASE READ AND SIGN THE FOLLOWING CODE OF CONDUCT:

In connection with any Regional program (including dances), including travel to and from such program: 1. There is to be no smoking.

2. There is to be no possession or use of any narcotics, marijuana, other illegal drugs or prescription drugs not prescribed for the user. 3. There will be no possession or consumption of any alcoholic beverages. 4. There will be no shoplifting or any other theft of any kind.

If a Kadimanik is caught in possession of/or using alcohol or illegal drugs, he/she will immediately be sent home at his/her parents' expense. Furthermore, USY International policy states: "If a Kadimanik is apprehended for an infraction of the International Youth Commission's policy regarding drug and alcohol abuse or any other criminal offense, including but not limited to shoplifting, punishment for that offense would include suspension from International events (including, but not limited to the International USY Convention and USY summer programs) for one year following the infractions. Individuals will also be prohibited from participating in the next major regional USY program and other events occurring in the interim, and prohibited from chairing events or staffing programs for six months. Individuals already in leadership positions would be removed. A major Regional event is a regionally sponsored overnight event, such as a convention, Kinnus or Encampment. Regions may impose additional sanctions at their discretion." The Region reserves the right to impose additional sanctions in connection with this or any other improper behavior as it sees fit.

5. All Convention delegates are expected to be in sessions (services, meals, study groups, etc.) No attendees may leave the convention except at those times specified by the convention schedule. NO Kadimanik may leave the premises without prior approval of the Regional Director and a parent.

6. All males are expected to bring a tallit and tefillin. All males are required to wear a kipah during all services, meals and study groups. Tallit/tefillin must be worn for morning services where appropriate.

7. Each participant is expected to maintain proper decorum and attitude during the entire program. Disruptive behavior (including, among other things, inappropriate sexual behavior) will not be tolerated. Your parents will be responsible to pay for any damage you may cause.

8. Proper dress is expected of everyone. All Kadimaniks shall wear clothing appropriate to the event/location. 9. All housing/rooming/bunking assignments are final. Changes can only be made by the Regional Director or her designee. All Kadimaniks

must be in their assigned house/rooms/bunks at curfew and remain there. Males are not permitted in sleeping rooms of females and

females are not allowed in the sleeping rooms of males. 10. Each participant is expected to conduct him/herself appropriately as a Conservative Jew (including through the observance of Shabbat

and Kashrut), in accordance with applicable standards of the Law and Standards Committee of the Rabbinical Assembly and/or the local

Rabbinical Authority. 11. No Kadimanik shall violate any civil or criminal law, including but not limited to, those related to tampering of or destruction of property,

and destruction of one's own or another person's physical and/or mental integrity. Inappropriate or unwelcome physical contact or

language, indecent attire or public nudity, shall not be permitted. 12. The Region reserves the right to search the room and belongings of any attendee if it has reasonable grounds to believe that such a

search is necessary to secure the health, safety and/or welfare of the program and or its participants. USY or Kadima Director, in consultation with the Regional Youth Commission, reserves the right to enforce other rules relating to the integrity of the Regional Youth Program and/or the health, safety or welfare of its participants.

13. Every Kadimanik is responsible of any damage he/she does or damage that occurs in his/her bunk/room or at the synagogue/campsite/hotel.

I have read these rules and understand them fully. I certify that I will adhere to this Code and will conduct myself in a manner reflecting credit upon myself, my chapter, congregation and community. Any violation of this code of conduct may result in the participant being sent home at his/her parents' expense. The Regional Director has the sole discretion to send a participant home.
